## MUSIC STRIKES A CHORD AT FARLEIGH

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We believe that childhood is enriched by experiencing music-making and appreciation, both in the classroom & through extra-curricular experiences.

At Farleigh, the whole school sings together in assemblies each week and hymns are practised as a whole school on a weekly basis, whilst every child is encouraged to learn an instrument. In Year 2, all are able to learn the violin free of charge. Pupils have access to a full music curriculum through individual instrumental or vocal tuition and by participating in various ensembles and performances. High standards are always expected, but even the pupil whose achievements are more measured is celebrated for effort.

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Pupils can fulfil their potential through the inspiration & enjoyment of music, whilst the opportunities afforded to children through music at Farleigh reflect our school ethos.

Not only does music allow for the development of myriad skills, it consistently develops pupils' spiritual, moral, social & cultural development.

- **Inspire** pupils to enjoy, understand & appraise music;
- **Develop** sensitivity, an awareness of expressive possibilities, listening skills & critical awareness, a creative imagination, and technical skills;

- **Encourage** lifelong learning and fulfilment, creativity, social skills, and awareness across the community, through rewarding & enjoyable musical experiences;
- **Promote** knowledge, skill, confidence & familiarity;
- **Enhance** the musical experiences of all children through relevant I.T. skills;
- **Nurture** the sense of awe and wonder which can be revealed through music.

## A NEW MUSIC SCHOOL: A SOUND INVESTMENT

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The new Music School  
will provide much-needed  
additional facilities, as well as  
freeing up space for additional  
teaching facilities.

Its internal recital space (seating 120), Rock Room, new music technology studio and teaching spaces will offer an exceptional improvement in music facilities at Farleigh and will be used by every single Farleigh pupil.



It is anticipated that the new Music School building will be completed in autumn 2016.

15 senior schools have offered Farleigh pupils  
a music scholarship in the past ten years;  
238 pupils learn at least one instrument  
& require teaching and practice space;  
386 music lessons are taught per  
week: over 100 more than were  
taught ten years ago.

Space is at a premium!

The existing music department is equipped with eight teaching/practice rooms, storage facilities (including instrument lockers) and office space, but the teaching rooms and very small assembly space are no longer fit for purpose.

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Our pupils' development continues to be a top priority. Supportive facilities in which children can learn, explore and grow are key, alongside opportunities to begin a life-long process of service, discovery and growth, nourished by the Catholic ethos which is central to all that we do.


The school has allocated significant funds to building the Music School from surplus income. However, we also need your help: Farleigh has no endowment and fees alone cannot continue to meet the cost of every aspect of school life.

In order to bring the new Music School to life, we need to kit out the Rock Room, install new sound and lighting equipment in the recital/performance space, equip each of the 12 practice rooms with a piano and upgrade numerous tired instruments and instrument lockers – amongst other things.
